

Who's the Leader? (15 min)

Split students into evenly distributed groups (15 students is ideal). It is fine to have small groups combined with each other. Have a leader present in each group. Have the leader pick someone from the group to stand in the middle and be the “guesser”. Have the “guesser” close their eyes and then choose a different person in the group to be the “leader”. The leader will make motions (snapping, waving hands, moving their body) and the whole group must follow what the leader is doing. The goal of the “leader” is to not get caught leading by the “guesser”. Once the guesser finds the leader, have that leader go to the middle of the circle and they become the new guesser.

Debrief Questions (within each group if possible): (5 min)

- Who was a leader?
 - What was it like to be the leader?
 - How did you feel being the leader?
 - What do you think the followers could have done better?
- Who was a follower?
 - What was it like to be a follower?
 - How did you feel being a follower?

- What do you think the leaders could have done better?

Note: This activity can be used as a simple game. If you are using it as a game there is no need to do the debrief questions. You can also use this as an introduction to a topic about leadership, about following our Leader- Christ, and anything else that you think this activity could be helpful to illustrate. If you are using it as an introduction to your topic, make sure you explain to the students how the activity relates to the idea that you are going to talk about.
